

PATHFINDER PRACTICAL SHOOTERS GUIDELINES

1. *The purpose of these guidelines are to ensure an orderly transition of Pathfinder Practical Shooters objectives from year to year. These guidelines may be modified by the Shoot Committee as needed.*

OBJECTIVES--- The members of this club have voluntarily associated together to:

- * Promote the sport of practical pistol, rifle and shotgun shooting.
 - * Encourage the growth of safe shooting in our community by presenting an annual program of Practical Shooting matches open to all qualified shooters, of good character.
 - * Promote greater gun safety in our community by sharing our knowledge of safe, practical gun handling techniques and ethics with others through an annual series of educational courses on safe shooting open to all qualified shooters, of good character.
 - * Encourage participants in our sport to develop those characteristics of self-control, honor, integrity and courtesy, which are the hallmarks of the Practical Shooters.
2. Pathfinder Practical Shooters (P.P.S.) will hold all monthly matches at Pathfinder Fish and Game Club, Crescent Road, Fulton, NY.

Pathfinder Fish and Game Board of Directors Meetings are held the Monday before the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 7:00 pm.

Pathfinder Fish and Game Club general meetings are held the 2nd Wednesday of each month at 7:30pm.

Any expenditure over \$100.00 must be approved by the Pathfinder General Membership.

3. Membership fees are to be paid to Pathfinder Fish & Game at their yearly rates.

P.P.S. match fees will be as follows:

- a. Members- \$12.00
- b. Non-Members- \$15.00
- c. 2nd Shoot- \$5.00
- d. 2nd Classifier- \$2.00

4. Monthly matches will be held as follows:

January - March - the third Saturday of the month

April - October - the third Sunday of the month.

(Unless otherwise published in the Shoot Report).

5. P.P.S. committee meetings will be held on the Saturday following match day as needed. The place and time will be announced in our Shoot Report or by telephoning. These meetings are open to any member of Pathfinder Fish and Game. Only P.P.S. Committee Members will be eligible to vote.

6. Election of P.P.S. committee persons will be held annually at the Year End meeting. This is to be organized by the Chairperson and published in the shoot report as an Annual Meeting. All members concerns are welcome at this meeting.
7. Monthly Awards shall be awarded by class, GM-D in Limited, Open, Limited 10, Production and Revolver. By categories: Ladies, Junior, Senior (50 years and over) and Super Senior (60 years and over).
Awards for Monthly matches follow these guidelines: Prizes will be given, one to every five entrants. Ex: 1 for 3-5, 2 for 6-10, 3 for 11-15 etc.
8. USPSA Classifications only will be recognized by Pathfinder Practical Shooters. If you are not a USPSA member or do not yet have a Classification, you will shoot as "Unclassified". We will give awards in this category only at the monthly match. You will only be allowed to win three {3} times. After three wins, you can only shoot for the overall match placement.
9. To be eligible for Year End Awards you must have:
 - a. Scores for 5 matches in the same class and category.
 - b. Worked 12 hours and be a paid member in one of the Eastern Lake Section Clubs.
 - c. Workers award pins will be awarded to anyone that works 20 plus hours per year. You do not have to be a Club member to receive a workers pin.
 - d. Awards for Y/E will be determined by participation and the above qualifications.
10. National slots for the Limited and the Unlimited Nationals will be awarded by previous Year End results.
 - a. High Over All
 - b. High Lady
 - c. First by Class GM- D
11. Range Officer Schools will be scheduled as determined by the Shoot Committee. The Club will reimburse members after successfully completing the course and working 20 hours.
12. A "*Worker's Incentive Program*" has not been established for monthly Matches for 2003.
